4	to the Education Committee Meeting, and I'm going to ask Andy

MR. SORRELL: You have a quorum, Mr. Chairman.
SENATOR RUFF: Can I have a motion for approval of
our minutes of 5-29-19? They're on the website. Do I have a
motion? All right, I've got a motion and a second. It's been
moved and seconded. All in favor, say aye. (Ayes). Opposed?
(No response). The minutes are passed.

MR. SORRELL: The first item of business is the 11 Extension for the Southwest Virginia Alliance for Manufacturing, 12 Southwest Virginia Advanced Manufacturing Center of Excellence, 13 known as SVAM COE, Number 3100. The Southwest Virginia 14 Alliance for Manufacturing Center of Excellence requests an 15 additional one-year extension on the COE grant, extending the 16 grant into a fifth year. Their Executive Director, Stephanie 17 Surrett, is here and has indicated the extension is necessary to 18 fully expend the grant funds for the COE's programming. The 19 current balance of the Tobacco Commission project account is 20 around \$412,000, or 13 percent of the original \$3.1 million grant 21 award. 22

23 Staff has received the budget detailing the allocations 24 of the remaining funds for the COE activities. With the grant 25 coming to an end, the Alliance has recently worked with

GENEDGE to gain further insight on their value to the local and regional manufacturing industry and how the Center of Excellence can continue to grow as an organization and what paths the COE could take to be sustainable past the end of the Commission's funding.

The Staff has reviewed the report-out material from the COE's work with GENEDGE and agrees it provides the key information on what steps are needed to take financial sustainability. The information gained from GENEDGE doesn't mean or take the place of an actual plan for how the Center of Excellence will actually be sustainable in the future.

In preparing all this, Staff has requested information 12 on how the Center of Excellence plan to implement the 13 recommendations from GENEDGE. Staff has not received the 14 information and feels that the grant should be extended long 15 enough to close out existing Commission-funded programming. 16 The Staff supports approval of the final extension. The Staff 17 expects to have information in the near future on all this. Staff is 18 looking forward to reviewing this and will make any future 19 recommendations. 20

SENATOR RUFF: Any questions or discussion?
 MR. HARRIS: Recommend we grant the extension to
 April 1st, 2020, as the Staff has recommended.
 SENATOR RUFF: Any discussion?

DR. EHRHARDT: Has the information been provided

1 that you wanted?

MR. SORRELL: Yes, it's been coming in. They're in 2 compliance with that. They're working towards that goal, as I 3 understand it. 4 SENATOR RUFF: I've got a motion and a second, any 5 further discussion? All those in favor, say aye. (Ayes). 6 Opposed? (No response). That motion carries. 7 All right, what's next? 8 MS. CAPPS: The next request is from New College 9 Institute, New College Institute Center of Excellence. They're 10 requesting an extension into the seventh year. It's an additional 11 request for one year, Phase I, Center of Excellence grant, and 12 that would extend it into the seventh year. 13 New College Institute's Executive Director indicated 14 the extension was necessary due to unexpected staff turnover 15 during the period. And New College staff changes include a new 16 coordinator for advanced manufacturing, funded by the grant, 17 and a second staff position that is in the process of being filled. 18 That person would be the coordinator of administration funding. 19 Changes in the Executive Director's position, also. 20 This grant was under a freeze for a year, from 21 September of 2017 until October 1 of 2018, with the exception 22 of critical operation costs, including funding of positions being 23 allowed for reimbursement. The freeze coincided with the 24 original grantee, New College Foundation, to New College 25

1 Institute.

And the balance on the Commission account is 2 \$743,000, including \$27,000, a refund payment was issued in 3 October to correct an accounting error. While the \$7,000-plus 4 balance is 38 percent of the original \$2 million grant award, Staff 5 received a detailed project budget with allocations of remaining 6 funds for the Center of Excellence development activities at the 7 New College. 8 There is complexity of development of the Center of 9 Excellence and the freeze that occurred and the changes in 10 personnel. So, the Staff supports approval of the one-year 11 extension to allow additional time to complete this approved 12 work. 13 So, Staff recommends approval of an extension to 14 September 22, 2020. 15 SENATOR RUFF: Any questions? We have a motion 16 and a second. Why don't you restate that motion. 17 MS. CAPPS. It is moved the Commission accept the 18 Education Committee's recommendation to grant a seventh-year 19 extension to September 22, 2020, for Project Number 2882, New 20 College Institute, Center for Manufacturing Excellence. 21 SENATOR RUFF: All right. All those in favor, say aye. 22 (Ayes). Opposed? (No response). That motion passes. 23 All right, that takes care of our business. Is there any 24 public comment, anyone in the public would like to make a 25
