FINAL MINUTES

Virginia Agricultural Council The Martha Washington Inn Abingdon, Virginia August 25 - 26, 2016

The Virginia Agricultural Council held their official annual meeting on August 25 & 26, 2016, at The Martha Washington Inn in Abingdon, Virginia. The meeting's purpose was to review the final grants approved for the upcoming fiscal year, the Council's financial status and view first hand projects funded by the Council.

<u>Thursday August 25, 2016</u> The meeting was called to order at 8:30 a.m., by Chairman T.D. Watkins.

Chairman Watkins began the meeting at 8:30 am and welcomed everyone in attendance. Chairman Watkins expressed his appreciation and gratitude to Jason and Paige Bush for their assistance with the arrangements for the tours and with other details. Chairman Watkins asked that each person in attendance introduce themselves. He introduced, Larry Harris as the new Executive Director of Virginia Agriculture Council. Mr. Harris has been with the state 39 years and recently retired from VDACS. He was the Director of Facilities in charge of building projects and statewide facilities and farmer's markets maintenance programs. Larry will be taking over starting in September.

Chairman Watkins asked Commissioner Adams to give an agency update to Council members. Commissioner Adams discussed recent trends and topics that included an increase in staff turnover and pollinator protection policy. She also thanked all Council members for their service and dedication.

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Chairman Watkins asked Dr. Saied Mostaghimi with Virginia Tech to provide Council members with an update on Virginia Tech. Dr. Mostaghimi thanked Council members for inviting him to the meeting. He noted that classes had begun and three departments Crop and Soil Environmental Sciences (CSES), Plant Pathology, Physiology and Weed Science (PPWS) and Horticulture have begun the merge into one large department which will be known as The School of Plant and Environmental Science. He informed Council members of the initiative that has begun to update all of the technology and equipment at all of the statewide AREC's. The goal is to be complete by the fall of 2017. There are current discussions with VT administration regarding the appropriate amount needed for this purpose and will involve the agricultural industry in discussing the next steps.

Minutes from the March 2016 meeting were discussed. Chairman Watkins asked for a motion to approve the minutes. Kathy Coffee motioned to accept the minutes as presented and Alan Worrell seconded the motion. The motion passed by unanimous vote of Council.

Chairman Watkins asked Jennifer Cavedo to review the financial reports with the Council. Ms. Cavedo began by discussing the FY 2015-2016 Year End Financial Statement.

Ms. Cavedo presented the financial condition of the Council through June 30, 2016. The beginning cash balance as of June 30, 2015 was \$386,329.80, revenues were \$364,744.14 and expenditures were \$318,354.29 which brought the YTD balance to \$432,719.65.

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Ms. Cavedo's next presentation slide addressed the Seed Fund Balance. At the last Council meeting members voted to adopt the same accounting methodology as non-seed fund to the seed fund. This slide represented the seed fund financial statement for the year. The beginning balance as of June 30, 2015 was \$60,703.65 added was revenue of \$35,812.34 and less expenses of overhead \$7,149.16 and grants paid out \$40,194.00 left the cash balance in the seed fund as of June 30, 2016 at \$49,172.83.

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Ms. Cavedo directed attendees to view the Revenue Differentials Spreadsheet (see spreadsheet below). She explained this spreadsheet compares the revenue for 2015-2016 to the five-year average for revenue. The spreadsheet shows a substantial difference in seed revenue by 51.07%, but Ms. Cavedo explained this to Council by reminding them a company that erroneous over reported in 2014-2015 and VDACS issued a refund this past fiscal year which accounts for the significant difference.

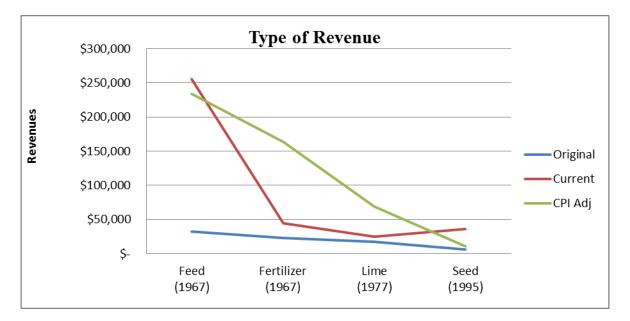
Ms. Cavedo presented the next slide which was a review of how the administrative costs are calculated and charged back to Seed Fund. This formula was established by the Office of the Attorney General as the Seed Fund was not originally part of the Council and was they were not paying into the administrative costs incurred by VAC. Ms. Cavedo discussed the formula used to charge the administrative costs for the Seed Fund, which is based on a five-year average. In FY2016, the seed revenue 5-year average was \$54,101.64 and 12.52% of the total expenses are \$6,775.06.

The next slide in the presentation shown was in response to a request from the Council at March's meeting to take the revenue figures in a graph and compare them using the Consumer Price Index (CPI). The chart below show revenues adjusted for CPI.



Mark Newbill motioned to approve the Financial Report and Joe Barlow seconded the motion. The motion to approve the Financial Report was passed by a unanimous vote of the Council.
