## **IV. New Business**

- a. Presentation- Long Acting Injectables for Substance Use Disorders and Serious Mental Illness- Dr. Douglas Brown MD- Virginia Society for Addiction Medicine Board
  - i. Discussed long acting prescriptions that help with treatment of SUD and mental health illnesses
  - ii. Injectables are not reimbursed for in-patient, doctors are more inclined to prescribe oral
  - iii. Virginia is in a SUD epidemic

- 1. Injectables can help get people to treatment centers
- iv. Discussed the value of Peer Recovery Specialists and the need to have them in Emergency Rooms
- v. A budget amendment will be brought to have long acting injectables reimbursed in in-patient situations \$500,000 first year, 1 MIL next
  - 1. People are encouraged to write, call their senators to endorse this
  - 2. HIFT program
- vi. Discussed PRS and Barrier Crimes
  - 1. Bill drafted for this year to reduce barrier crimes for adults
  - 2. Discussed the instability of employment/pay for PRS due to it going through grants
  - 3. DBHDS has data on amount of people with barrier crimes that have sought employment at DBHDS
  - 4. SAARA had town meetings and resources surrounding BC's
- vii. Deaths in VA due to OD's is stable (high, but even) in the last 3 years we have lost 300,000 young to middle aged people
  - 1. Treatment programs have been shown to work!
- viii. Discussed benefits of injectables for patients incarcerated
- ix. Data for escort savings in jails requested
- x. Discussed the issue of housing when paired alongside BC's
- xi. Idea: better system for tracking how people with mental health disorders are doing on a day to day basis. (To track medications)
- b. Va Opioid Abatement Authority: grants are available to cities and counties for abatement projects
