Assistant Secretary of Education Justine Taylor-Raymond Discussed All IN VA plan ALL IN VA Guiding Principles:

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- 1. High Dosage: Tutoring 5 days a week, 18 weeks for at-risk students below passing.
- 2. Low Tutor/Student Ratio: 1:10 with two groups of 1:5
- 3. Acceleration Approach: Teaching grade level material while addressing gaps in learning
- 4. Grade-Level Materials: VDOE will provide digital tutoring materials and grade level practice at no cost to divisions and families
- 5. Trained and Supported Tutors: Provided digital materials, lesson plans, and training
- 6. Relationships: Tutors meet regularly with the same students
- 7. Progress Monitoring: Embedded in digital tools

Interested in seeing if other universities would host similar Town Hall events. Great turnout, students were well-researched.

- 1. Business and Trade: Digital literacy and language access
- 2. Civic Engagement: Voting was a big concern, demographic data, appoint more APIDAs into state and local appointments, translation materials
- 3. Education: Inclusion of Asian American Pacific Islander history, civic engagement, concerns about book bans, language access, disaggregated data, higher education highlighted need for financial aid, food insecurity, housing struggles, student worker rights on campus.
- 4. Health: Health insurance was notable, access to health care, language barriers, translation for services and providers, education campaign about alternative herbal remedies because western medicine is beneficial to health.
