#### III. Ongoing Projects

# a. Douglas Avenue Reorganization

 Reorganizing space allocation for the collections and the necessary utilities such as HVAC, plumbing, water, and electrical systems.

#### b. Pavilion & Stairway

- The Pavilion is progressing, with concrete work scheduled for next week.
- Discussions centered on the design and aesthetics of the stairway, including the

#### d. Maintenance on Starling Ave.

 Addressed the issues with the VMNH parking lot and repaired the pavement holes left from past tent installations.

### IV. Future Considerations

#### a. Status of YMCA

- The committee discussed a potential acquisition of the YMCA building beside VMNH on Starling Ave.
- The committee also noted the need to explore real estate transfer options.
- The committee agreed to keep this opportunity on the table while waiting for further details on the property.

### b. Discussions with the City Regarding Park and Canopy Walk

- Martinsville City Council has expressed interest in collaborating with VMNH on plans to enhance Wilson Park, including the proposed canopy walk.
- The project could have potential for funding through the Tobacco Commission and Harvest Foundation.
