1. Call to Order, Establish Quorum

Dr. Sarah Thomason, chair of the OAA Grants Committee, called this meeting to order. The following Grants Committee members were in attendance: Senator Todd Pillion (virtual – residence is more than 60 miles from meeting location), Mr. Mike Tillem, Mr. Timothy Spencer, Ms. Sharon Buckman, and Delegate Briana Sewell (virtual – residence is more than 60 miles from meeting location). We have a quorum. Ms. Debbie Ritter and Mr. Craig Markva are present. Anthony McDowell, Charlie Lintecum, Adam Rosatelli, James Schliessmann, Matthew Terrill, Cindy Newman, Kathleen Dupre, Jennifer Sawyer and Cara Moisan are present from the OAA.

Mr. Lintecum provided a summary of each of the amendments and applications listed on the agenda. Mr. McDowell pointed out that sometimes there is a time lag in localities spending their funds as these projects are new and take time to get up and running. It’s been a challenge for the OAA team to keep track of what funds have been spent in what fiscal year, etc. There will be delays in the implementation of future projects as well due to carry-forward in addition to what’s being granted. Senator Pillion asked if there is anything the Board can do to help localities expedite their processes, or if the complexity of the grants and the nature is part of the cause. Mr. McDowell stated that some of it is due to the OAA’s strict requirements surrounding applications. He mentioned that the OAA’s resource coordinators are a huge asset for the customer service piece on the local level to assist localities in putting together complete applications. Mr. McDowell mentioned that Chesterfield is the fiscal agent for the first recovery high school. The General Assembly provided additional money to fund two more, one in Loudoun and one in Virginia Beach City. He mentioned that Waynesboro City, Staunton City and Augusta County are being proactive in using their cooperative funds to start their own recovery high school. He highlighted that localities and legislators may request money from the General Assembly for their own recovery high school programs, but receiving OAA funds does not affect the General Assembly’s allocation decision. Senator Pillion asked if the Chesterfield Recovery Academy Outreach and Transportation project would be an ongoing budget request, or if they will be requesting funds from the General Assembly for ongoing operations, and Mr. Rosatelli confirmed they have expressed their desire to advocate for project funding via the legislature, however the OAA will recommend that they not invoke the OAA in such lobbying efforts. Mr. McDowell reminded the Board that Chairman Pillion tasked the staff with creating a special grant category to address the need in the community with the highest rate of opioid overdose deaths, and the OAA is very excited that the seven

eligible localities all applied for their Operation STOP! grants. One of the requirements for Operation STOP! is that the localities work with and join in periodic meetings with VCU Wright Center to assist in data gathering. Dr. Thomason expressed her gratitude to the OAA staff for their work.

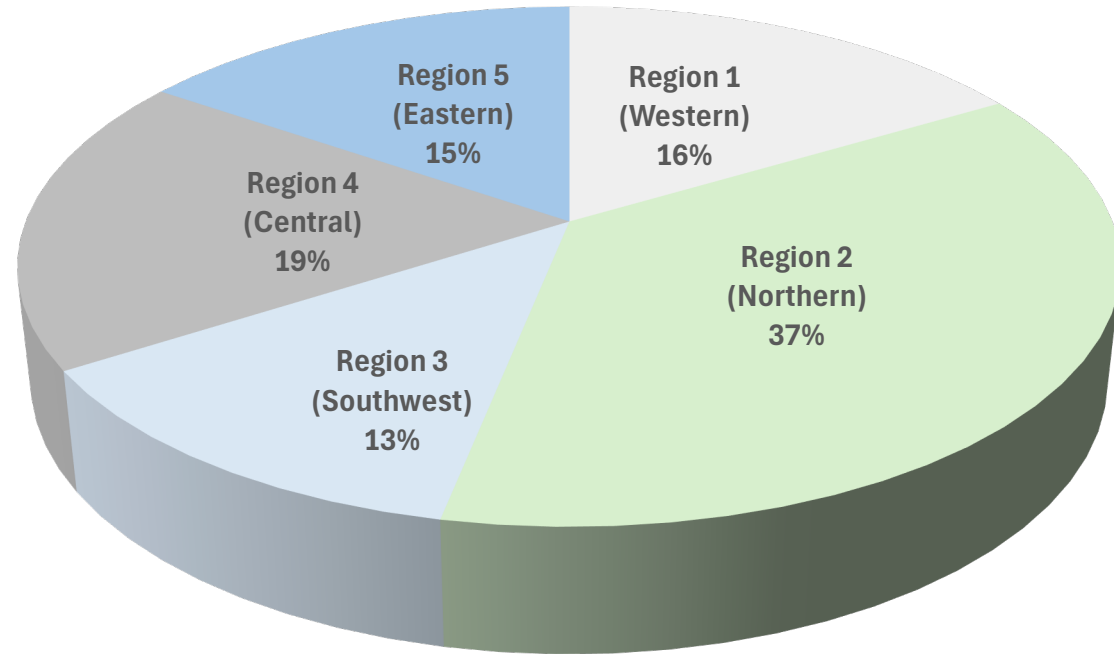

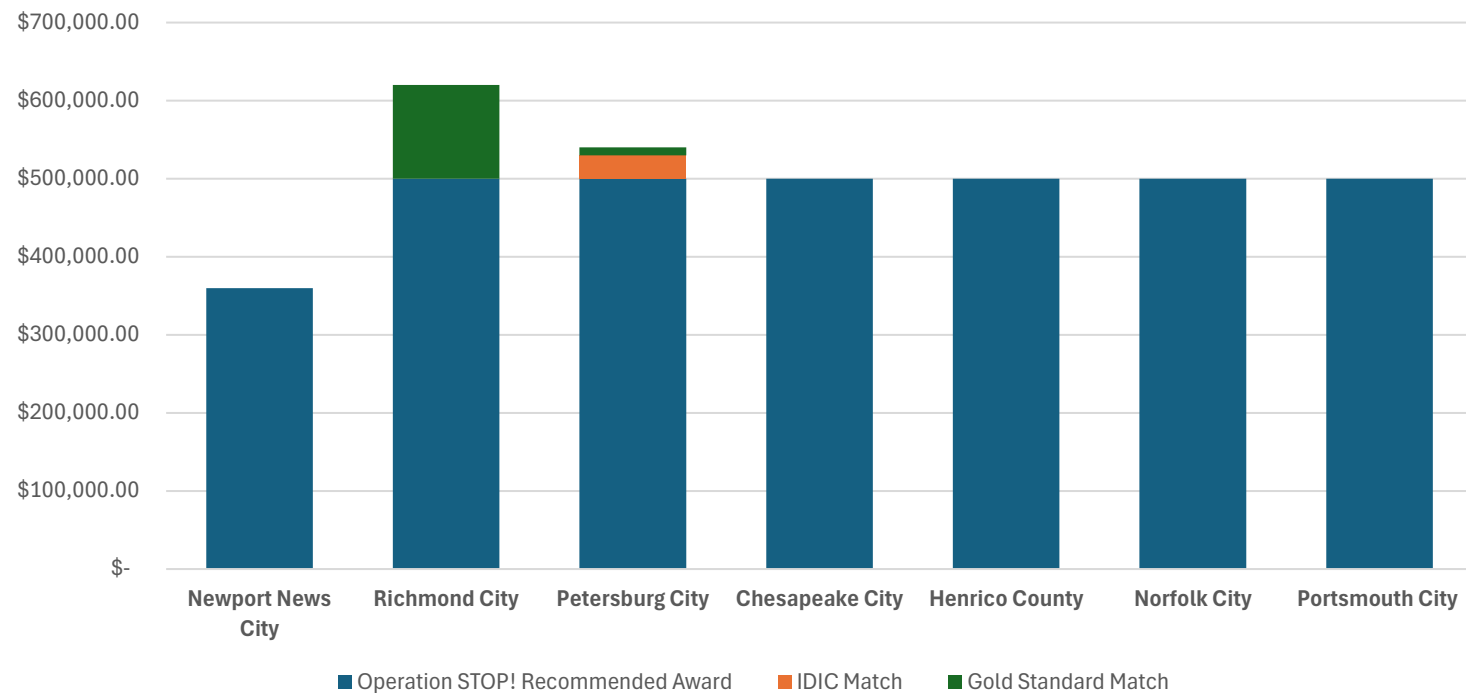

- All recommended for \$500,000 except Newport News at \$360,000.



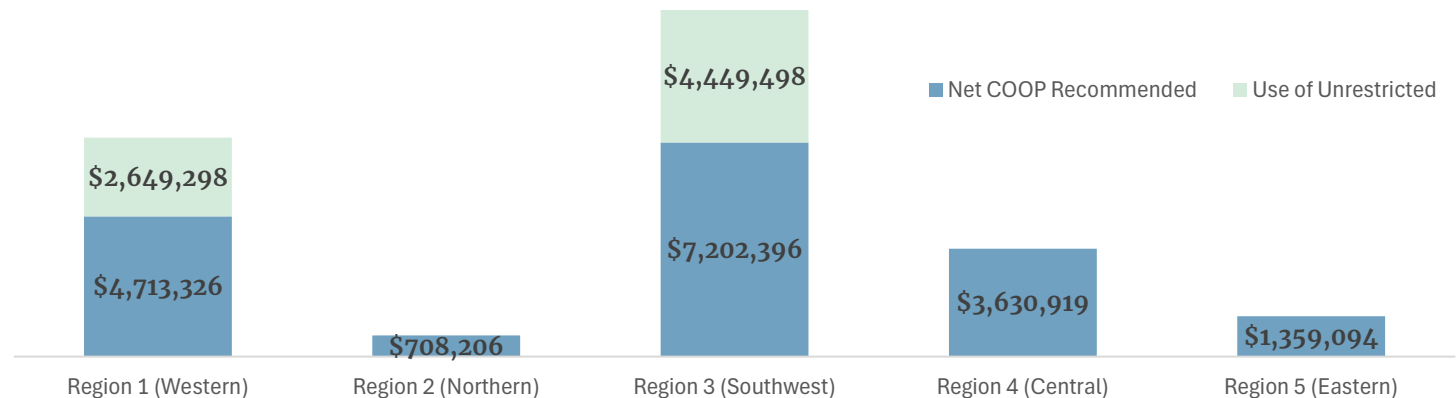

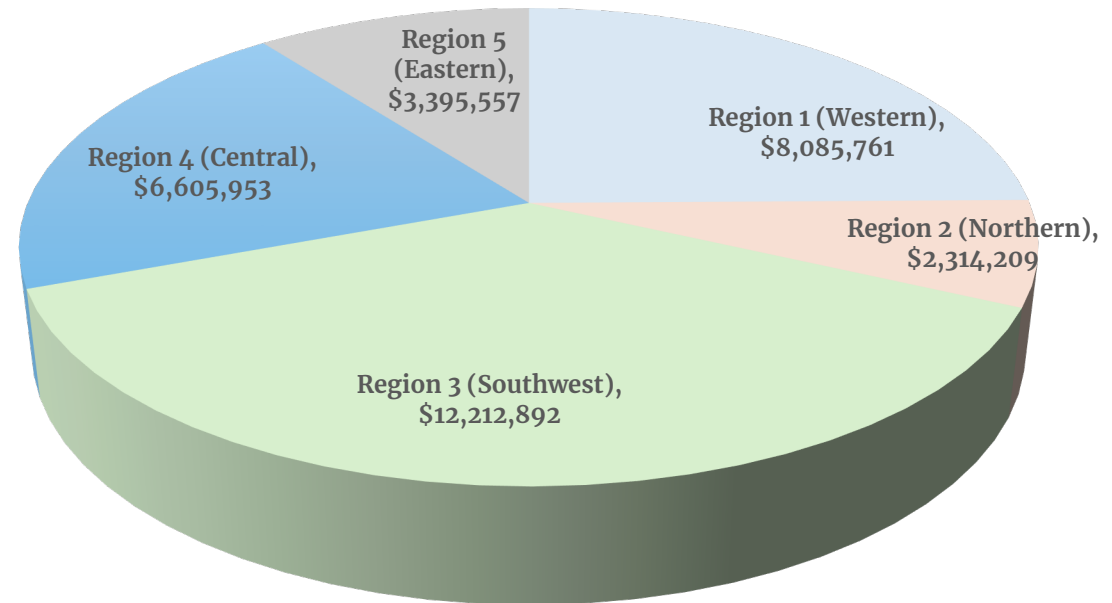

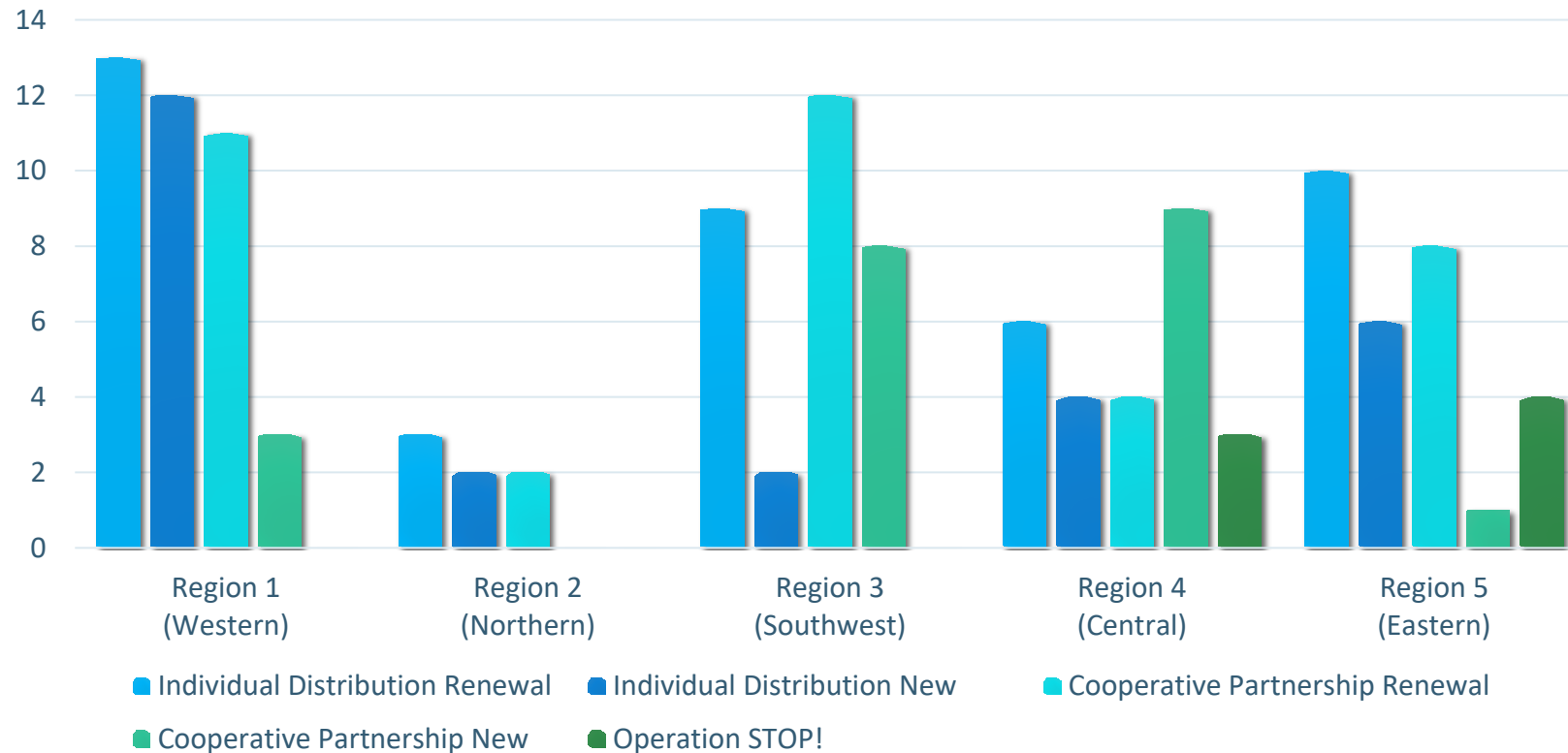

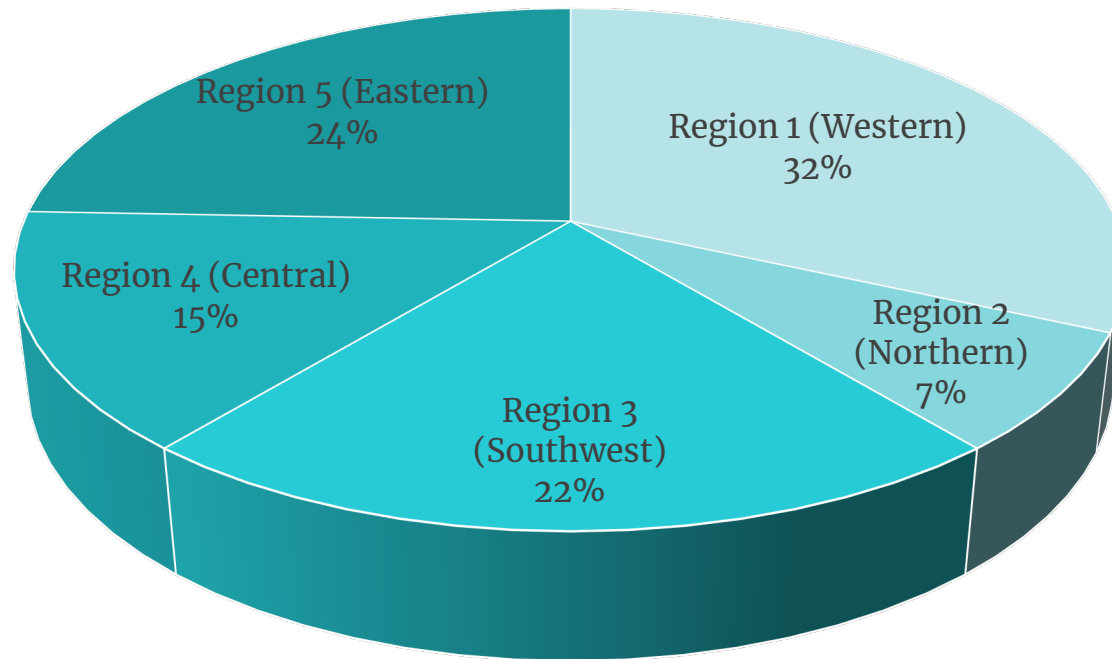
Applications Received by DBHDS Region

2024-2025 OAA City & County Applications by DBHDS Region by Application Type



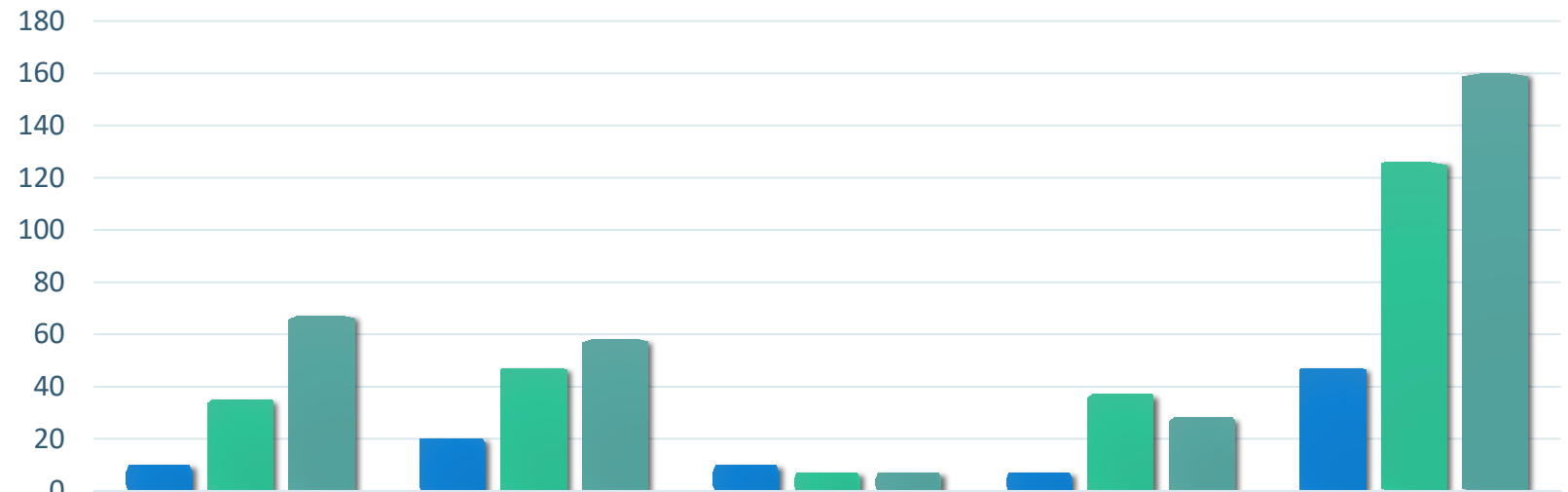

Standard OAA Award Contingencies

For All Awarded Projects

- Ensure subscribed and regularly reviewing the contents of the "Virginia Opioid Abatement Authority News Update" newsletter where OAA publishes pertinent information and requirements including dues dates, instructions, guidance, etc. that all applicants and awardees are required to follow.
- New Projects
 - Completed written agreement (MOU/contract) between fiscal agent and sub-recipients
- Renewals
 - Carryforward – Encumber 80% of carryforward before FY26 funds transmitted
 - Carryforward - Complete the OAA's Carryforward True-up Process

For Cooperative Partnership Applications

- New Projects
 - Complete an Operational Agreement amongst all partner cities and counties before funds transmitted
- Capital Projects – Complete Capital Costs Agreement (maintain approved use for 15 years) before FY26 funds transmitted
- Renewals
 - Acknowledgment of cap for future year renewal amounts



OAA Award Contingencies for Specific Grants

- Capital Projects – Complete Capital Costs agreement (maintain approved use for 15 years) before funds transmitted
- Amendments - Update Operational and/or written agreement w/ subrecipient to incorporate amendments before funds transmitted
- Documentation securing Non-OAA matching funds before OAA funds transmitted
- Provide finalized copy of Request for Proposals (RFP)
- OAA transmits 50% of award once all pre-transmission contingencies are complete and will transfer the other 50% once the fiscal agent is able to provide evidence that at least one-third of the project’s objectives/milestones have been met and related funds encumbered
- Certain Harm Reduction Projects - Fiscal agent and all partner cities and/or counties agree to abide by all state and federal laws including, but not limited to, Virginia Code §§ 18.2-265.1, 32.1-45.4, and 54.1-3466. Also, that Drug Checking Services (DCS) will be performed solely for approved opioid abatement efforts and not for the benefit of drug dealers, drug sellers, or any other third parties.
- Provide a detailed yearly report related to actions of this project as an attachment to the project’s annual report
- Share project data with Virginia 2-1-1 and 9-8-8 once gathered and whenever updated. Evidence of the data sharing will be an attachment to this project's OAA annual report.
- Award is for a 1-year pilot project and the performance of both the fiscal agent and the subrecipient will impact OAA's decision in renewing and/or potentially increasing funds for future years.
- OAA awarded funds and/or projects shall not be used for or connected to any legislative advocacy efforts throughout the Commonwealth.
- Project was submitted to OAA with only 1 year of funding requested and while the project will be eligible to submit a renewal request (which can include carryforward), the project will be competing against all new projects for any additional funding.

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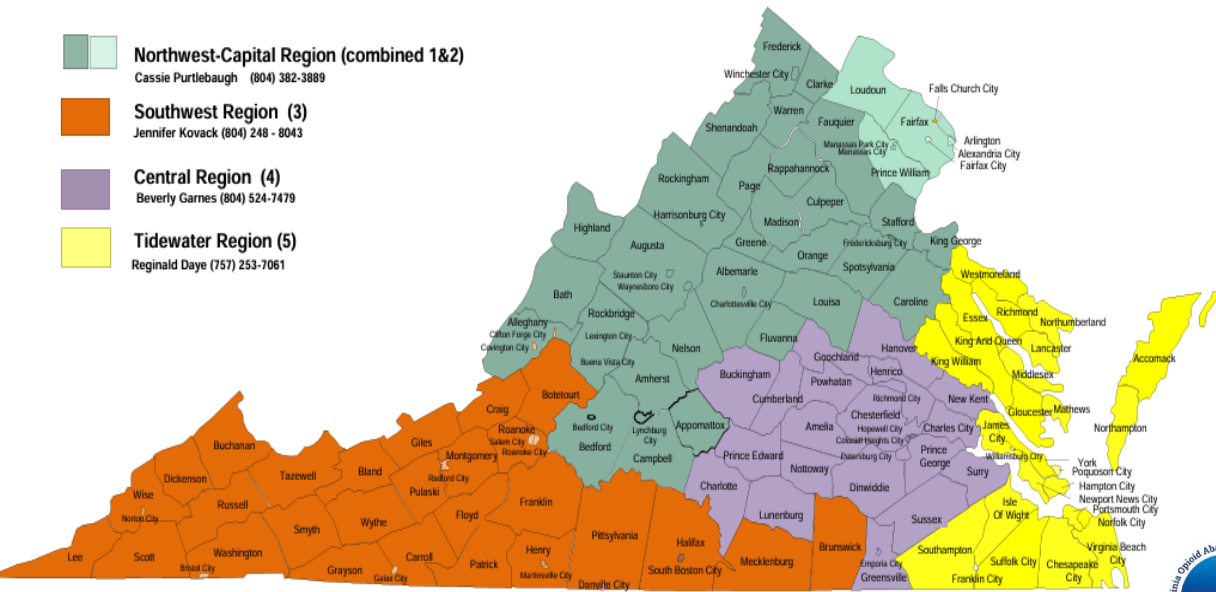

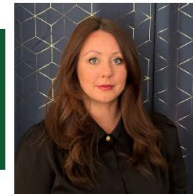

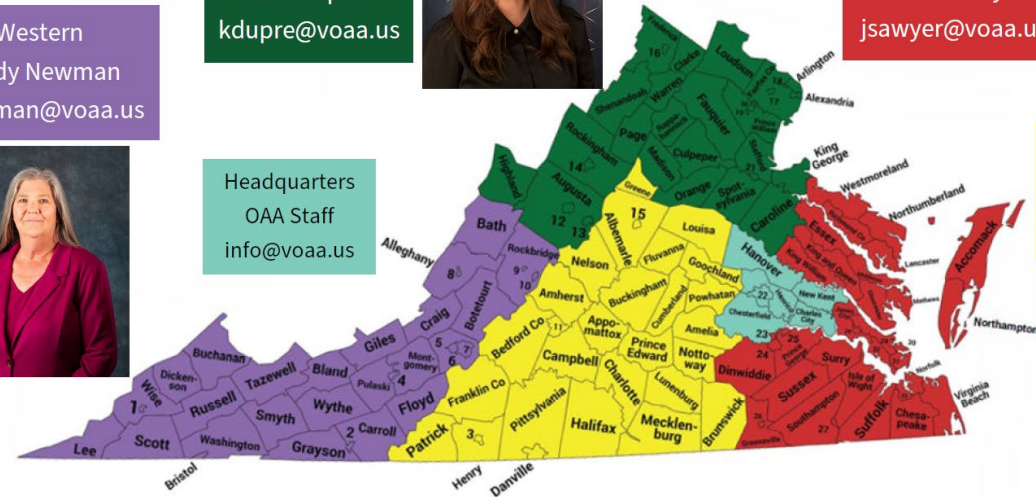
